Approximately 270 bursaries are available each year and are available across 22 sports currently. The bursary scheme covers technical qualifications from entry level 1 through to tutor, assessor and verifiers and offers financial support to cover up to 60% of the course cost. The reimbursement to successful individuals on the completion of their course and after they have delivered their prescribed number of voluntary coaching hours, Level 1 = 6 hours, Level 2 = 12 hours and Level 3 = 18 hours. As a direct result of the 400 bursaries being granted, over 2500 voluntary coaching hours have been delivered in to local clubs across a variety of sports within the region. The bursary is open to individuals or sponsor organisation.
